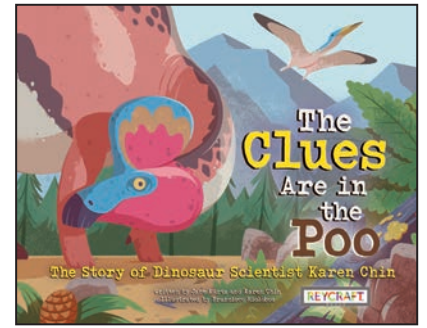
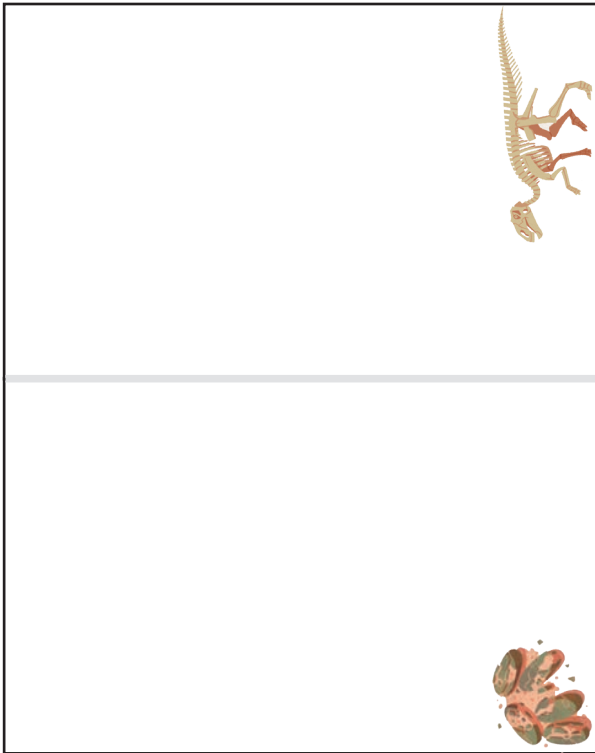


My Curiosity Notebook

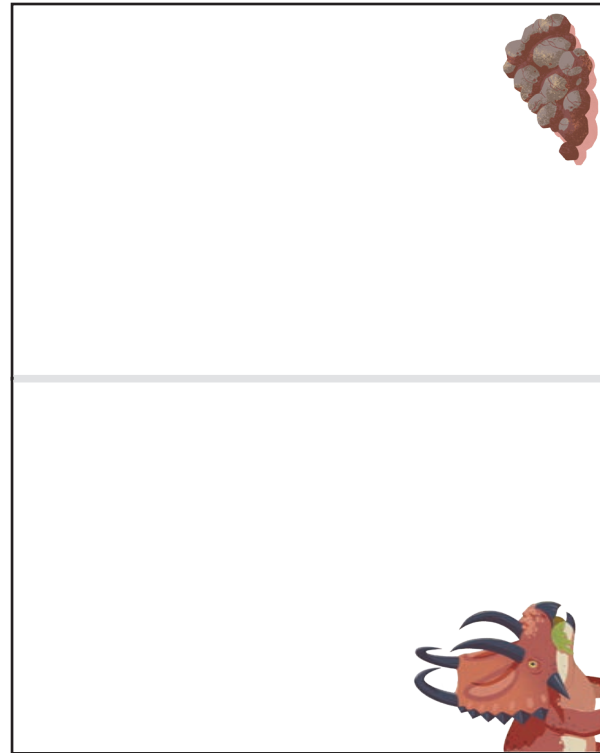

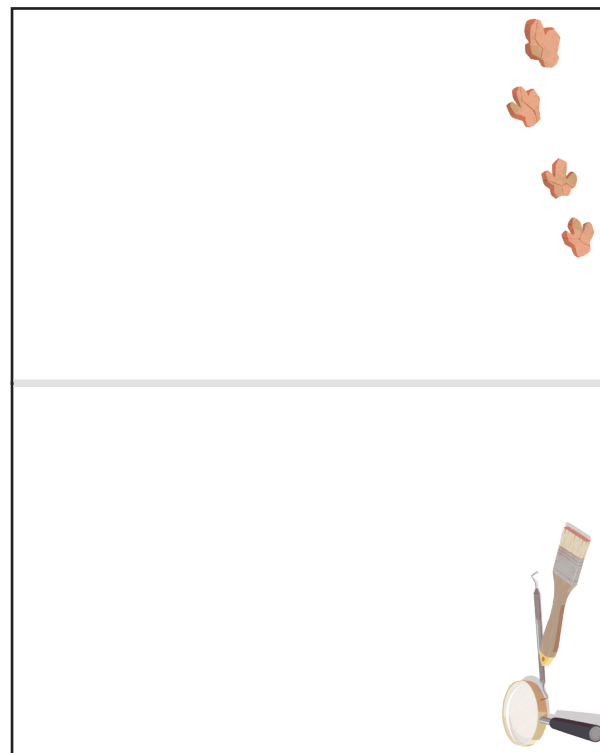

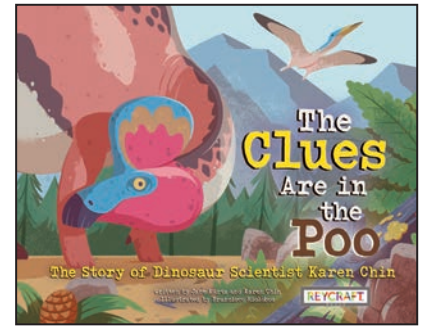


Cut out the rectangles and stack the pages with the cover on top. Staple along the center line to bind into a mini notebook.
